

Communication, Language and Literacy:

- Practising pencil control

Physical Development:

- Take part in a yoga session
- Developing gross motor skills, jumping, hopping, skipping

Understanding of the World:

- Talk about going shopping, different types of shops.
- Talk about the different characters in the book and the roles - farmer
- Using the interactive whiteboard
- Looking after our new class pets – guinea pigs.
- Take part in planting some seeds.

Mathematics:

- Recap Number 10, looking for number 10 in the environment
- Practising counting 1-10
- Practising our number recognition & formation
- Introducing 2D shapes, making pictures and patterns
- Sorting and matching, shapes, colours and numbers

Creative Development:

- Make a Giant picture
- Use imagination to explore role play
- Make 2D shapes pictures
- Experiment with colour mixing
- Make a picture using different resources and colours

Key Questions

What happens in the story? Who are the characters? How do you think Jack felt hiding from the Giant? Why was the Giant so mean and greedy? What could the Giant do to be kind?
